Are You Ready for the Challenge of Teaching Global History?

The Department of History at Rutgers, The State University is proud to announce a new **Master's Degree in Global and Comparative History**. Centered at the New Brunswick Campus in one of the nation's foremost programs in global history, the Master's Degree has been created especially for current and prospective teachers facing the challenges of offering broad-based, substantive, and compelling courses in world history and cultures at the middle and secondary school levels.

The 30-credit program includes a selection of graduate courses on key culture areas, such as China, Islam and Africa; thematic courses on subjects ranging from the environment to women and gender in global history; and a core course on approaches to teaching and thinking about global history.

Some features of the program include:

- **Strength of Scholarship.** With nearly 20 faculty members working on various aspects of global history, the Rutgers History Department has long been a national leader in training college teachers in world history and bringing global perspectives to courses on European and American history.
- **Small Classes.** Enable extensive and personal interaction between faculty and graduates, and among Master's and doctoral students.
- **Flexibility.** Late afternoon and evening classes make it possible for working professionals to pursue their teaching responsibilities while they complete an advanced degree, either full- or part-time.
- **Accessibility.** With easy access to the Turnpike and NJ Transit, the program is available to teachers throughout New Jersey.
- **Educational Value.** With capstone courses and final projects tailored to each graduate's teaching needs, the program provides the in-depth historical background, instructional skills, and curricular orientations needed to develop and sustain successful programs in global history and world cultures.

The History Department at Rutgers has a long-standing commitment to public school education, as evidenced by its Master's Programs at Newark-NJIT, the *High School Summer Teachers' Institute*, as well as workshops regularly offered to middle and secondary school teachers by the Center for Historical Analysis.
