## HISTORICAL EXHIBITION

Spend some time at the Historical Society of Princeton and see their current exhibition on Rex Goreleigh. Arriving in Princeton in 1947, Rex Goreleigh (1902-1986), an African-American artist, spent nearly 40 years in Princeton making and teaching art. Goreleigh spent the initial years of his career in Princeton as Executive Director of Princeton Group Arts, an attempt to bridge racial divisions in Princeton through the visual and performing arts.
